Please note that if you don't renew your membership, this will be the last newsletter you receive until you do so.




## **Working Bee**

"HAIR" is a rock musical – a product of the hippie counterculture and sexual revolution of the 1960s. Several of its songs became anthems of the anti-Vietnam War peace movement. The musical's profanity, its depiction of the use of drugs, its treatment of sexuality and its irreverence for the American flag caused much comment and controversy. The musical broke new ground in musical theatre by defining the genre of "rock musical". "HAIR" tells the story of the "tribe", a group of politically active hippies of the "Age of Aquarius" living a bohemian life in New York City and fighting against conscription into the Vietnam War. Claude, his good friend Berger, their roommate Sheila and their friends struggle to balance their young lives, loves and the sexual revolution with their rebellion against the war and their conservative parents and society. Ultimately, Claude must decide whether to resist the draft as his friends have done, or to succumb to the pressures of his parents (and conservative America) to serve in Vietnam, compromising his pacifistic principles and risking his life. (Please note that in AMT's production of "HAIR", there will not be a nude scene.)

## MTNZ National Conference & Volunteer Training Weekend 2016

This was held last weekend in Rotorua and was attended by a massive 329 theatrical persons from around New Zealand and a good time was had by all. Ten AMT members attended and the highlight of the weekend was Barry Jones receiving a Merit Award for outstanding service to Musical Theatre. Barry's reaction to this award follows ...



Barry Jones first became involved with New Plymouth Operatic Society in 1985, in his early 20's, when he played the piano for the Societies production of "Oklahoma", but his interest in theatre had been well ensconced several years before this when Barry would sneak into the back of NPOS rehearsals to watch, under the pretense of picking up his sister Alison, who was a regular dancer in NPOS productions. Since then Barry has amassed over 70 productions as Musical Director and countless more as rehearsal/production pianist.

From 1985 through to 1997 Barry was involved as Musical Director or pianist for every one of the 26 productions staged by New Plymouth Operatic in that time, under the mentorship of NPOS Patron Shirley Murphy. In early 1998 a career change saw Barry move from New Plymouth to Palmerston North to study teaching. While based in Palmerston North, Barry has still maintained his close connections with New Plymouth, returning to support the major production each year, as well as returning to New Plymouth in 2004 and 2006 to musically direct productions of "Jesus Christ Superstar" and "Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat" staged at the TSB Bowl of Brooklands.

Since becoming a member of Abbey Musical Theatre in 1998, Barry has musically directed many more productions for them, including almost all of their major productions staged at the Regent Theatre. This includes such blockbuster shows as "The Phantom of the Opera", "MAMMA MIA!", "CATS", "Miss Saigon" and "Les Misérables".

Barry's love of theatre continues today through both his continuing involvement with Abbey Musical Theatre and his 'day job' at Palmerston North Intermediate Normal School (PNINS). Barry is the music specialist at PNINS who have been an education member of MTNZ for quite some time. Barry's "dream job" sees him developing the next generation of local talent, including staging school productions from the 'Junior' catalogue with his students every second year, with great success. Under Barry's guidance, PNINS produced the first school's version of "CATS" in New Zealand.

After more than 30 years of dedicated commitment to the theatre, it is an honour for New Plymouth Operatic and Abbey Musical Theatre to jointly nominate Barry Jones for an MTNZ Merit Award.

It was fitting that a close friend of Barry's and AMT's, Grant Meese, also received a Merit Award at the Conference. Congratulations are extended to both Barry and Grant.


